By the time kids are out of high school only a rare few still have the confidence to choose the creative arts as a career.

This exhibition is a place where work can be shown without fear of judgement and its value is in restoring confidence in "Yourself as the Artist" and celebrating the whole of the art journey from beginner to professional artist.

Overall it shows the great diversity of the programs on offer in the neighbourhood house network of the Barwon region of Victoria.

A big thank you to Christine Brooks and the Barwon Neighborhood House Network for putting on the show, doing all the emails and EOIs and for giving me this opportunity to curate these wonderful works. Also many thanks to the Shearers Arms Gallery and Geelong Art Society for hosting us and to our sponsors for funding the show.




